# 11th Annual "Big-Game Hunt" = Family Affair!

Stewart Lowder of Albemarle and Darren Poplin of Wadesboro notched top prizes in the 11th annual Big-Game Hunt Tournament that was held Thanksgiving weekend.



Stewart Lowder, first place winner in the Buck Division with a 148.4-pound buck.

Lowder's 148.4-pound, 11-point buck netted him \$800 (\$700 for first place, \$100 daily prize), narrowly edging out Roger Pike Davis of Ansonville, who weighed in a 148.2-pound, seven-point buck for second place and \$475. Jamie Poplin of Wadesboro finished third with a 143.3-pound, eight-pointer worth \$400; John Albertson of Charlotte took fourth place with a 128.9-pound, eight-pointer for \$200; and David Webb of Monroe finished out the Top Five with a 127.6-pound, nine-point buck worth \$75.

In the doe category, Darren Poplin of Wadesboro took the top prize with a 111.4-pounder worth \$700 plus a \$100 daily prize, followed by Randy Thomas of Marshville with a 104.5-pounder; John

Bishop of Kannapolis, 104.0 and \$400; Shane Thomas of Polkton, 99.4 and \$200; and John Springer Jr. of Wadesboro, 94.5 and \$125.

In the youth overall buck category, Kevin Bye of Lilesville took the top prize of \$300 (including a \$50 daily prize) with a four-point, 106.1-pounder; and Jake Edwards of Peachland earned \$200 (including a \$25 daily prize) and second place with an eight-point, 101.4-pounder. Justin McCall of Wadesboro earned \$75 third place (including a daily prize of \$15) with a button, 57.6-pounder. Kevin Cabrera of Peachland earned \$50 fourth place (including a \$15 daily prize) with a button, 56.5-pounder.

In the youth overall doe category, Elizabeth Tarlton of Wadesboro took first place with a 115.3-pounder, earning \$250 plus a \$50 daily prize. She was followed by Jake Black of Wadesboro, 92.5 and \$200; and Ethan Henson of Vilas, 83.1 and \$125. Mason Krol of Mount Gilead won a free entry in next

year's event. Tarlton's 115.3-pound doe set a youth tournament record, eclipsing the 2002 record set by Darren Poplin. Brett Sikes holds the youth record for a buck at 158.1 pounds set in 2000. "Everything went well," observed Lynn Edwards, executive director of the Anson County Chamber of Commerce, the tournament's sponsor. "Everyone enjoyed the food at the Saturday night banquet." Edwards estimated that 250 people attended the banquet festivities. God's Country Outfitters of Albemarle was the 2008 Title Sponsor. Edwards said Perdue provided the chicken, while Pepsi and Coca-Cola donated the soft drinks for the banquet. She said hunt volunteers had set up a special room for youngsters, ages nine and under, "to walk through and choose a prize. Youths ages 10 and up were given a door prize ticket for the drawing. We had something for everyone who attended the banquet." In addition, the 286 registered hunters for the 2008 tournament tied the record set in 2006. "We had a lot of new hunters entered in our event this year," Edwards said. In drawings, David Webb won the 270caliber Remington; Greg Mecimore took home the tree stand; and Avery Harrington garnered the \$100 cash prize. Pick Board winners were Bron Hyatt, first place, who won a Cuddeback Scouting camera; Kevin Thomas, second, who won a 15-foot ladder tree stand; and Jake Mecimore, third, who won a NRA ceiling fan. Edwards said each youth's name was entered in a special drawing. Brandon Biles won the youth rifle; and Kori Ann Davis and Hunter Sheppard each won a \$50 prize. Edwards thanked all of the hunt volunteers for their time, the corporate sponsors and members of the Big-Game Hunt Committee, who oversee the annual event. The 2009 Big-Game Hunt Tournament dates are Nov. 27-28.

## Local Handmade Food gets Rave Reviews!




Walk in B&B in a bad mood one day while he is there and you will probably walk out smiling saying to yourself "God broke the mold when he
